Can a computerised machine transport you to optimum wellness?

IT'S CLAIMED TO BE ABLE TO IDENTIFY over 9 000 human imbalances, pinpoint emotional disturbances, repair DNA and advise you on the diet and supplements that will steer you away from current and future disease.

The Quantum Xrroid Consciousness Interface (QXCI) was first launched in 1985, based on the theory that, since everything is made up of energy, energy can be harnessed to aid healing. The machine's inventor, mathematician and physicist Dr William Nelson, claimed the QXCI was capable of harnessing this energy.

It works by sending out electromagnetic waves to the person being treated, and then measures the frequency with which they're returned. The waves enter the body, where they resonate with tissues, organs, nutrients, toxins and aller-

gens, and, by recording the body's reactions, the machine picks up imbalances, deficiencies and sensitivities.

But Dr Nelson's invention wasn't registered correctly on launch, causing it to be temporarily banned until it was reclassified as a "biofeedback mechanism".

Similarly, upon its arrival in South Africa in 2000, the QXCI couldn't be registered with the Ministry of Health as it didn't have European Certification. "But," assures Quantum Energy SA agent Marianne van Rooyen, "you can now be legally treated by the upgraded version, known as SCIO."

what can SCIO do for you?

Naturopath Dr Charl du Randt says the device works holistically and naturally, to stimulate the body's ability to self-heal.

SCIO is also an indicator of underlying energy imbalances, he says, and by identifying potential problem areas, the practitioner can prescribe a diet and supplements to correct imbalances, improve health and prevent potentially life-threatening illnesses. In addition, the machine's electromagnetic waveforms apparently stimulate the healing of tissues and dysfunctional cells.

Are there any conditions which the SCIO can't help? "No," says du Randt. "By improving the performance of human systems, it can have a positive influence on any health problem." This includes anything from toothache or muscular relief, to whole-body health through treatment of the chakras. Adults, children and even pets can all be treated, he says.

This healing process, says du Randt, is objective; it isn't influenced by the preconceptions of either patient or practitioner. And it's computer-driven, so it's accurate — what devotees call the perfect balance of energy and technology.

what does it cost? Treatment costs vary between practitioners, but the average is R500. However, you'll probably be advised on a range of supplements to facilitate healing, which could set you back another R500—R700.

Tip: Check if the practitioner includes a live blood analysis in the treatment. This, says du Randt, will provide valuable extra information on your state of health.
